religious education in liberal pluralist societies such as the uk the usa and australian underwent radical change in the 1980s and 1990s with a major shift towards multi faith educationally oriented programmes this has meant significant modifications to both the content and the methodology of religious education courses and to the way they are conceived of and taught in schools and universities one important implication of this change for the teaching and study of religion today is the need for a philosophical dimension that deals with issues such as the truth status of religious statements and the moral acceptability of religious claims this dimension is often insufficiently developed this lack is made more critical by the multiple competing truth claims of various religions giving rise to such contentious problems as the growth of fundamentalism increasing religious intolerance and conflict and differences of opinion on central moral problems such as birth control abortion and euthanasia this text attempts to provide the philosophical underpinning that the study and teaching of religion in modern societies requires

the existence of minorities will grow in most countries of the world because of sociopolitical upheaval and economic crisis both of which result in waves of migration contributors to this volume discuss the task of education to alleviate the problems arising from the mix of peoples of various ethnic cultural linguistic and religious backgrounds no education system alone can create a just and equal society and education by itself is not enough to achieve peace nevertheless educational efforts assisted by other institutional commitments and actions are essential in order to create an atmosphere of justice mutual recognition and acceptance as preconditions for peaceful coexistence within groups and between people as a result of worldwide migration in reaction to wars and other geopolitical conflicts as well as economic crisis many modern nation states consist of a mix of people of various ethnic cultural linguistic and religious backgrounds indeed there are very few countries that are monocultural here contributors discuss how it is imperative that multicultural education be promoted to achieve awareness then tolerance and finally acceptance of ethnic and other diversity within societies

in england multicultural education is one of the most important focal points within the ongoing educational debate to answer questions of practical policy multicultural education may be viewed from the perspective of education as social process more than simply pupils and teachers classrooms and textbooks education provides social continuity and engenders social change a process linked to powerful structural and ideological variables in the wider society education may vary according to the importance placed upon individual development compared with the perceived needs of society as a result of this dichotomy all educational systems must strike a balance between educating for variety and educating for conformity between diversity and cohesion in a culturally pluralistic society the tensions between these poles are particularly great a plural society is by definition more diverse and thus has a greater need for conformity yet it also has a greater natural resistance to conformity british educationalists are now faced with deciding at what point the acculturation necessary for full participation in society becomes a repressive assimilation and at what point the celebration of diversity ceases to enrich and becomes potentially divisive diversity and conformity are in fact interdependent and majority children can benefit as much as minority children from multicultural education kh
